SIDEWALKS

According to Code of Iowa, Sec. 364.12(2)b, ALL PROPERTY OWNERS MUST KEEP SIDEWALKS CLEAR of snow and ice. The following is an excerpt from the State Code:

364.12(2)b. The abutting property owner is responsible for the removal of the natural accumulations of snow and ice from the sidewalks within a reasonable amount of time and may be liable for damages caused by the failure of the abutting property owner to use reasonable care in the removal of the snow or ice.

Please remember that you are responsible to clear the sidewalk that abuts your property.
